MODULE DESCRIPTION

Module Aims	This module investigates the economic, legal, and strategic challenges UK businesses face in the post-Brexit landscape. Students analyse shifts in trade, regulation, and employment, and assess business responses to evolving conditions. Emphasis is on developing informed strategies to navigate uncertainty and change.
Teaching Arrangement	The module builds on a blended approach including lectures and readings, group work, and presentations.

Learning Outcomes	 By the end of this module, students should be able to: Critically assess the fundamental changes imposed by Brexit on UK businesses, including supply chain management, operations, and regulation. Evaluate the economic and business impact of Brexit on production, costs, employment, and trade with EU and non-EU countries. Analyse the post-Brexit regulatory framework, identifying key changes in taxation, duties, tariffs, and trade agreements. Develop strategic responses for businesses to navigate challenges and opportunities in the evolving post-Brexit trade landscape.
